## **REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION AS A PHARMACIST IN PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND**

### **NON MRA/INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS**

1. completed application form
2. verification from current licensing body that applicant is licensed and in good standing, i.e. “certification of standing”.
3. statement of disclosure regarding any convictions or civil remedies relating to the practice of pharmacy obtained against the applicant; or any conditions placed on current license to practice pharmacy by any licensing authority.
4. proof of graduation from an accredited degree program in pharmacy
5. proof of identity via birth certificate, passport or Canadian citizenship
6. PEBC Certificate of Qualification, Part I and Part II
7. verification of English proficiency
8. successful completion, including payment of fees, of legislation examination administered by the PEIPB
9. successful completion of a 20 week( 12 community site plus 8 hospital) structured practice experience program and one week assessment, including payment of fee (\$1,000)
10. successful completion of 16 weeks of additional practice experience, 8 unstructured and 8 with the Board’s manual (35 hours per week)
11. forward “Pharmaceutical Information Program (PhIP) Registration form to the Provincial Government

### **Notes:**

- (i) Any documents submitted in a foreign language must be accompanied by an English translation.

- (iii) English proficiency is outlined in NAPRA’s “Language Fluency Requirements for Licensure as a Pharmacist in Canada”, see [www.napra.org](http://www.napra.org)
- (iv) It is the responsibility of each applicant to arrange practice experience sites. Applicants must register with the PEIPB as “interns” and have their practice experience sites and preceptors approved before commencing the structured practice experience referenced in #9 and #10. Practice Experience manuals will be provided to the intern and preceptor upon request by the intern, when the intern is prepared to commence the practice experience program.
